They were introduced to the school motto and Ryan the Lion, our school mascot, during an assembly performed by our Kindergarten Student Ambassadors. In addition to providing a world class education, we have the responsibility SAFETY of maintaining a safe school **FIRST** environment. During the school year, we practice various types of safety drills to ensure that students and staff are aware of procedures during an unexpected emergency such as a fire, severe weather, a school intruder, or an earthquake. Practicing for unexpected events helps to maintain the safety of our students should our community experience any type of unusual activity. Please be assured that we partner with the Hanover Sherriff's Office in an ongoing effort to continuously assess our procedures.

Also please note the following information that all Hanover County Schools are required to share with parents.

The Hanover County School Board recognizes the danger sex offenders pose to student safety. Therefore, to protect students while they travel to and from school, and attend school or school related activities, each school in Hanover County school division shall request automatic electronic notification of the registration or registration of any sex offenders in the same or contiguous zip codes as any school within the school division. This information is obtained according to the procedure established by the Virginia Department of State Police. Please know that your child's safety and educational progress are our first priorities and that we fully expect to have another wonderful school year due to our outstanding staff, wonderful community support and fantastic students.

### **Fall Gifted Referrals**

Teacher referrals most often occur during the spring testing window which closes January 30<sup>th</sup> to allow additional time to get to know children and to collect work samples. We encourage parents to discuss their child's performance with their teacher as they will have insight into gifted characteristics and above level benchmarks.


