We hope you will support the PTA by joining today! As always, our goal is to reach 100%, but in the years past, we have only reached approximately 60%





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## Principal's Corner - Ms. Karen Carpenter 👺 🍣 🤻



Welcome to the Laurel Meadow Family.

We are very excited to begin our eighth year as a school community and look forward to another successful year. The following tips will help families make the transition into school routines.

Attendance - Regular school hours are 7:45 a.m. until 2:30 p.m. Please call the clinic at 723-2046 before 9:00 if your child is going to be



absent from school. When you call, please give your child's name, teacher's name, and a reason for the absence. When your child returns to school, please send a note to the classroom teacher indicating the reason for the absence.

**Tardy** - A student is considered tardy if they have not reported to the classroom by 8:05 a.m. Students arriving to school after 8:05 a.m. must come to the main office to sign in and receive a tardy pass. A child who is consistently tardy is



missing vital information at the beginning of the class period and causes a disruption to the entire classroom. Please strive to have your child at school on time daily.

**Building Hours** - Students are permitted to enter the building at 7:30 a.m. Students entering the building between 7:30 a.m. - 7:45 a.m. will be supervised in the cafeteria until the morning bell rings.

**Student drop-off** - In the morning, students may be dropped off in the loop in front of the school. Because the morning is a very busy time, please have your child ready to exit the vehicle when you pull up and make a complete stop. Move completely past the building towards the parking cone before stopping. This will allow two vehicles to unload at the same time and will help us eliminate traffic congestion. There will be someone on duty until the tardy bell at 8:05 a.m. to supervise children as they enter the building.

**Student Pick-up** - A student may leave the school premises during the day only with the permission of the parent or legal guardian. We require written permission if anyone other than the students' parent or quardian picks them up from school. We will ask for a photo

identification of the person signing out the child for safety reasons.

Afternoon student pick-up will occur in the school cafeteria. You will need to sign your child out and be prepared to show a photo id. This process will help to ensure the safety of our children. The best place to enter the cafeteria will be via the cafeteria door. This door opens at 2:20 unless there is a late assembly in the cafeteria area.

**Medication** - Hanover County's medication policy prohibits the transfer of any type of medication (prescription or over-the-counter) by your child. All medications must be brought to the clinic by an adult and a permission form to dispense must be completed by the parent or legal guardian. Any medication taken at school for 10 days or more requires a doctor's written order.

Toys/Valuables - Toys, trading cards and valuables are not permitted at school unless they are for a special project or activity.

**Student Dress** - Students are encouraged to wear comfortable shoes and clothing. However, student attire must not be a distraction to the learning environment. Messages on clothing that relate to inappropriate topics including: drugs, alcohol, tobacco, vulgarity, violence, or



that reflects adversely upon persons because of their race, sex, color, creed or national origin will not be permitted in school. Shorts, skorts, or skirts should be mid thigh or longer. Midriffs, spaghetti strap tank tops, and wide arm muscle shirts are not

appropriate for the learning environment. Tank top straps should be the width of two adult fingers. Flip flops, crocks and high heeled shoes present a major hazard on the playground equipment and stairs. Children wearing inappropriate footwear will have limited access to some of the playground equipment due to safety concerns.

Front Doors - The front doors of the building will be locked at 8:15 and will remain locked all day. This practice will help ensure the safety of all students. To enter the school building, please ring the bell next to the entrance door. Someone in the office will "buzz" you in, and then you must report to the office to sign in.

Safety Procedures - During the year we practice numerous safety drills. Reviewing and practicing safety procedures is important to ensure that our staff and students know how to respond in an emergency situation. We conduct fire, severe weather, lockdown, and bus drills during the course of the school year. In addition, our Crisis Team meets on a regular basis to review and refine our emergency procedures for all types of critical situations. Offender Registry and Family Watchdog Information - The Hanover County School Board recognizes the danger sex offenders pose to student safety. Therefore, to protect students while they travel to and from school, and attend school or school-related activities, each school in the Hanover County school division shall request automatic electronic notification of the registration or reregistration of any sex offenders in the same or contiguous zip codes as any school within the school division. This information is obtained according to the procedure established by Virginia Department of State Police. 
Annual Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) Management Notification - In accordance with the requirements of AHERA, Laurel Meadow Elementary School is notifying its employees, building occupants, and their legal guardians of the availability of the AHERA management plan for public review. The AHERA Management Plan contains documentation of all AHERA surveillance and inspections, employee training, and the Operations and Maintenance procedures. #### **Fall Gifted Referrals**

October 15<sup>th</sup> is the deadline for fall gifted referrals. Teachers and parents may refer a child for screening. Teacher referrals most often occur during the spring testing window which closes January 30<sup>th</sup> to allow additional time to get to know children and to collect work samples. We encourage parents to discuss their child's performance with their teacher as they will have insight into gifted characteristics and above level benchmarks.

Please do not feel obligated to participate in every fundraiser. We appreciate any support that you can offer for the enhancement of our school.



## **CHARACTER CORNER**

This year students and staff will, again, focus on the Six Pillars of CHARACTER.

CHARACTER Education is a national movement creating schools that foster ethical, responsible, and caring young people by modeling and teaching good CHARACTER through an emphasis on universal values that we all share. The CHARACTER traits that we will focus on are Respect, Fairness, Caring, Trustworthiness, Responsibility and Citizenship.

The Character Trait for the month of October is **RESPECT.** Students will learn to treat others with **RESPECT** by being tolerant of others and accepting of our differences, using good manners and not bad or hurtful language, and being considerate of the feelings of others. At home, parents can be supportive by teaching your child basic social interaction skills. It may sound old fashioned, but it's very important to teach your child basic manners like saying "please" and "thank you." When your child deals with his/her teachers in school or gets his/her first job and has these skills to fall back on, it will really go a long way. Understand that using manners—just a simple "excuse me" or "thank you"—is also a form of empathy. It teaches your child to RESPECT others and acknowledge their impact on other people.
