

SOL Grant:

Laurel Meadow receives an SOL Grant annually. We utilize the funds to provide additional instructional support in the areas of reading and math by employing Mrs. Loretta Gordon and Mrs. Karen Thracker. Both of our tutors have had a wealth of classroom experience and are experts in implementing strategies that support student learning. They typically work with small groups in grades 3-5 to reinforce critical skills in the areas of reading or math. Their support enhances our ability to differentiate instruction in these two critical instructional areas.



School Improvement Goals:

Laurel Meadow Elementary School is accredited by the state annually based on the results of the annual SOL Assessments administered in grades 3-5. In addition to receiving state accreditation, Hanover County Public Schools are reviewed every five years by AdvancED. This organization conducts rigorous, on-site external reviews of PreK-12 school systems to ensure that every learner realizes their full potential. Part of the process revolves around each school developing overarching goals that meet and exceed the State Accreditation Goals. As always, LMES will continue to focus on individual student achievement and continuous school improvement. However, as a school community, we will focus on the following three goals in order to meet the expectations of AdvancED.

Goal 1. To increase the SOL Pass Rate of current students from an 81.4% overall pass rate to a 84% overall pass rate on the 2016 Reading SOL test.

Goal 2. To increase STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) learning opportunities for all students in an effort to promote 21st Century Learning Skills such as collaboration and communication.

Goal 3. To increase parent participation in informational sessions designed to enhance their understanding of the instructional process.


Celebrate!!

This year, November 17th will be the inaugural **National Healthy Lunch Day.**


