It is truly difficult to believe that Spring Break is over and that we are approaching the final nine weeks of school. This last stretch is packed with activities such as Field Day, the Arts and Science Festival, Spring Book Fair, SOL Testing, Muffins with Mom, Kindergarten Registration, the Variety Show, Walk to School Wednesday, Teacher Pizza Delivery Night, the LMES Rock-n-Roll 5K, and the Fifth Grade Promotion Program. Please be sure to check Tuesday folders for detailed information in reference to all of these important events.

As we think of Spring, everyone starts to think of warmer temperatures and outdoor activities. Parents, please remember that our school is air conditioned, and school attire needs to be appropriate and safe. Please see the Fashion Alert below, and review it with your child. We will distribute individual reminders as needed until the end of the school year.

In addition, children will be spending more time outside as the temperatures are warmer at home. Make sure your child stays safe by following a few general guidelines: check their bike helmet to ensure that it is properly fitted, remember the sunscreen,

Kindergarten registration is scheduled for Thursday, April 14th 8:00 am - 4:00 pm at LMES. We are looking forward to meeting our new students.





Fashion Alert




As temperatures get warmer, we would like to remind students and parents of the appropriate dress attire for school. Please ensure that your child adheres to the following Dress Code for LMES:

- Shorts should be at least fingertip length when your child's arms are resting straight by their side.
- Tops should have at least 1 inch straps. (Spaghetti straps, tube tops, halter tops, midriffs, and muscle shirts are not appropriate for school.)
- Flip flops are not safe in the building or on the playground. (Sandals with straps on the back are preferred. Please continue to wear tennis or running shoes on PE days!)



CHARACTER CORNER

RESPONSIBILITY is the Character Education trait for the month of April. RESPONSIBILITY is a duty or obligation to satisfactorily perform or complete a task. If the duty or task is not complete, there can sometimes be a penalty or consequence. It is the RESPONSIBILITY of each LMES student to be prepared and ready to learn each day. How can parents help teach their child RESPONSIBILITY?

- ◆ Get your child to school on time and ready to learn. Your child should be on time daily and bring everything he/she needs for the day with them (their homework, a lunch, etc.) and be organized.
- ◆ Teach them to respect the teacher. Remember to encourage your child to use manners when speaking with teachers. Students don't have to always like what the teacher asks them to do, but they can still be respectful.
- Make sure your child is behaving, paying attention, and listening closely in class. If other students start talking, remind your child he/she can quietly tell them to stop and listen. If they still don't stop, just ignore them.
- ◆ Turn in homework. Make sure you know what homework is due for your child. Encourage your child to spend a sufficient amount of time on homework every night and to turn it in on time.
- ◆ Teach your child to help others. We all need help in our lives at some point. Teach your child to be kind to others. If he/she sees another student who needs help, encourage him/her to lend a helping hand.

Students who demonstrate RESPONSIBILITY through self-control and dependability will strive to do so even when there is no one watching to hold them accountable. We will encourage LMES students to develop the trait of RESPONSIBILITY through group work, class jobs, and showing "grit" when meeting academic and social goals. Keep up the hard work, Lions!


