# Principal's Corner - Ms. Sandra Crowder



#### Tardy Bell Rings at 8:00:

This is a reminder that the tardy bell rings at 8:00 a.m. Tardiness has a negative impact on learning outcomes on the tardy student, as well as the other students. When students arrive, even a few minutes late, they miss out on activities designed to build connections with their peers, potentially impacting their social interactions during Morning Meeting and creating a sense of alienation from their classmates.

When students arrive late, they receive fewer hours of instruction than students who are in class at the ring of the bell. Students who are late miss out on important announcements, team-building, and academic activities. Arriving late also establishes bad punctuality habits and disrupts the learning of the other students.

LMES Lions are counting on you to get them to school on time. Thank you for having students here between 7:30 and 7:55 so that they can be in their classes when the bell rings at 8:00. Being on time ensures the Lions are RESPECTFUL, RESPONSIBLE, and READY TO LEARN.



What are Executive Functioning Skills? These are skills that help us accomplish tasks from beginning to end without giving up. Children need lots of practice developing these skills. What can you do at home to help? PLAY GAMES!!! When students play games, they learn to plan, organize, begin a task, organize materials, focus on important information, use time wisely, and work through challenges. These skills help students with their classroom studies. Here are some games you can plan (Holiday Shopping Lists??) with your child to increase their skill set:

Jenga: Jenga takes a great deal of planning to make sure the tower does not fall down.

Scrabble: In addition to the vocabulary that can be built, Scrabble requires planning and organization to build off of other players' words.

Pictionary: This game requires extensive time management skills in order to draw/guess the picture before time is up.

Chess: This game requires concentration, planning, and flexibility in thinking.

Sudoku: In addition to the critical thinking skills necessary to play this numbers game, it requires perseverance and working memory.

Freeze: This free game is old-fashioned, but great for building self-control and attention.



#### **BIKE SAFETY**

There are so many great reasons to ride your bike: It offers fun, freedom and exercise, and it's good for the environment. We want kids and families to ride their bikes as much as possible. Here are a few tips so that you'll be safe while you do so.





#### **TIPS**

- 1. Wear a properly-fitted helmet. It is the best way to prevent head injuries and death.
- 2. Ride on the sidewalk when you can. If not, ride in the same direction as traffic as far on the right-hand side as possible.
- 3. Use hand signals and follow the rules of the road. Be predictable by making sure you ride in a straight line and don't swerve between cars.
- 4. Wear bright colors and use lights, especially when riding at night and in the morning. Reflectors on your clothes and bike will help you be seen.
- 5. Ride with your children. Stick together until you are comfortable that your kids are ready to ride on their own.

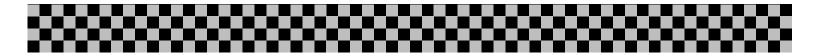
