We are hoping to have a Box Tops competition, so continue to save those box tops!


We do not have a general PTA meeting in January, so please feel free to contact me with any questions, concerns, or ideas at mergyrx@aol.com.

Inclement Weather: The new calendar year and the season of lower temperatures brings the possibility of more inclement weather. Due to the unpredictable nature of the weather, please remain aware of possible late openings or early closings by listening to the radio/local news and checking the Hanover County Public Schools website (www.hanover.k12.va.us), HCPS Twitter, HCPS Facebook Page, and Channel 99. (School closings are usually shared with the local media by 6:00 a.m.) If schools close early due to changing weather conditions during the day, your child's classroom teacher will follow the directions you specified on the Emergency Early Dismissal Plan at the beginning of the school year. You should update this information as soon as possible if your child's inclement weather plan has changed. Hopefully, it will be a mild winter and school closures will not be needed this winter.

FIRE PREVENTION FOR BIG KIDS

Big kids are curious about fire. Teaching your children about the hazards of playing with matches and other flammable materials, as well as practicing a fire escape plan with your family, can help prevent accidents and injuries.

Top Safety Tips

- 1. Working smoke alarms reduce the chances of dying in a fire by nearly 50 percent. They are a critical first step for staying safe, but in order to be effective, they have to be working properly. For the best protection, install smoke alarms on every level of your home and in every sleeping area. Consider installing a smoke alarm that has a 10-year battery.
- 2. Teach kids never to play with matches, lighters or fireworks.
- 3. Keep candles at least 12 inches away from anything that can burn, and always blow them out when you leave the room or before you go to sleep. Teach older kids not to use candles in their bedrooms, unless supervised by an adult.
- 4. Use common sense in the kitchen. Limit distractions when cooking and don't leave a hot oven or stovetop unattended.
- 5. Have a fire extinguisher in the kitchen in case of emergency, and make sure you know how it works. You might be surprised that most people don't know how to use one.
- 6. Children should know how to respond to the sound of a smoke alarm. Teach them to get low and get out when they hear it. A child who is coached properly ahead of time will have a better chance to be safe.
- 7. Practice feeling the door, doorknob and cracks around the door with the back of your hand to see if they are too hot. Help your children practice this step.
- 8. Together, have your family plan and practice a home fire escape plan with two ways out of your house in case of a fire. It is important to have an alternate exit in case one is blocked by fire. Choose a place to meet outside that is a safe distance away from your home.
- 9. If you cannot safely escape your home or apartment, keep smoke out of the room by covering vents and cracks around the door and call 911 or your fire department as quickly as possible. Then signal for help at the window with a light-colored cloth or a flashlight.
- 10. To prevent possible fires, avoid plugging several appliance cords into the same electrical socket.
- 11. If using gasoline-powered devices, store gasoline in a locked location where children cannot access it. Keep only small quantities in an approved container that has child safety features.
