We hope you are enjoying reading <u>The Trumpet of the Swan</u> with your family. "Study after study shows that early **reading with children** helps them learn to speak, interact, bond with parents and read early themselves, and **reading** with kids who already know how to read helps them feel close to caretakers, understand the world around them and be empathetic citizens of the world."— Washington-Post, 2017.

"A new study provides evidence of just how sustained an impact reading and playing with young children can have, shaping their social and emotional development in ways that go far beyond helping them learn language and early literacy skills. The parent-child-book moment even has the potential to help curb problem behaviors like aggression, hyperactivity and difficulty with attention, a new study has found."—New York Times, 2018

February is African-American History Month. As we celebrate this month, talk with your children about the swan in <a href="Trumpet of the Swan">The Trumpet of the Swan</a>. He is named after Louis Armstrong, an African-American jazz musician who was one of the most influential musicians of our time. 

What is mindful listening? The MindUp Curriculum says "Mindful listening helps us choose which sounds to focus our attention on and helps us to be thoughtful in the way we hear and respond to the words of others. Research suggests that students become more focused and responsive to their environment by participating in mindful listening activities."

How can you help your child with mindful listening at home?


- · Have your child choose a sound they enjoy hearing. Have them write about or sketch the sound to express how they feel when they hear it.
- · Discuss with your child what sounds they find relaxing and what sounds they find unsettling. Have them compare and contrast these sounds.
- · Discuss with you child a time when they listened carefully to someone and were able to avoid an accident or solve a problem because of it. Why is listening important?




